

Dedication of New Wharf and Highway To Honor Admiral Donald B. MacMillan

Gov. Furcolo To Attend Ceremonies Saturday

Governor Foster Furcolo will be present next Saturday morning at the dedication of the new Town Wharf, to be known as Admiral Donald B. MacMillan Wharf, and will make the principal address.

In the afternoon, the new Admiral Donald B. MacMillan Highway will be dedicated.

The ceremonies will begin at 11 a. m. with a selection by the Provincetown Band at the head of the Wharf. Mrs. MacMillan will unveil the plaque, and Governor Furcolo will cut the ribbon at the wharf. There will then be a parade down the Wharf, and Irving T. McDonald will open the ceremonies, followed by the Rev. Gilman L. Lane, pastor of the Provincetown Methodist Church, who will give the Invocation.

Judge Robert A. Welsh will then introduce Governor Furcolo, who will make an address, and Joseph Lema, chairman of the Board of Selectmen, will make the response. Rear Admiral Donald B. MacMillan will make remarks, followed by Benediction which will be given by the Rev. Leo J. Duarte, pastor of the Church of St. Peter the Apostle. The group of dignitaries will then return up the wharf.

After a reception and luncheon at the Flagship, the ceremonies of dedicating the new highway will begin at 1 p. m. The Rev. Hugh Wallace Smith, pastor of the Church of St. Mary of the Harbor, will say grace, and there will be remarks by Rodolph G. Besette, Director of the Division of Waterways, Department of Public Works. Carl B. Sheridan, Commissioner of the Department of Public Works, will unveil the Highway dedication signs. An address will then be given by Senator Edward C. Stone, and the ceremony will conclude with Rear Admiral MacMillan's response.
