The Modern Exhibition has therefore been presented the last six seasons by a group of its members as a separate feature.

The present showing is by the more conservative group who to an extent, continue in the older traditions and carry on the regular summer exhibition.

We hope that in both these displays our old friends and those who are now first making our acquaintance may find pleasure.
