





CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Article II. Objects and Purposes. The objects and purposes of this Association shall be to promote and cultivate the practice and appreciation of all branches of the fine arts, to assemble and maintain for the town of Provincetown, a collection of works of art of merit, to hold temporary exhibitions, and by forums, concerts, and similar activities to promote education of the public in the arts, and social intercourse between artists and laymen. To these ends it shall operate strictly within its charter as a non-profit, educational, artistic, and cultural organization.

MEMBERS

Section 1. Membership in this association shall be divided as follows:

- a. Associate Member-Dues \$5.00 per year.
- b. Contributing Member-Dues \$10.00 per year.
- c. Sustaining Member-Dues \$25.00 per year.
- d. Life Member-\$100.00.
- e. Patron-Any person contributing \$200.00 or more.
- f. Benefactor-Any person contributing \$500.00 or more.

PROVINCETOWN ART ASSOCIATION RULES

- Balanced juries are to be selected one week after the Annual Meeting by the Vice-Presidents and their make-up submitted in writing. No changes in name, month or composition of a jury are to be made without the written permission of four out of five Vice-Presidents.
- 2. Each juror shall have the right to include one work over the vote of the others after the jurying and such action to be recorded in writing.
- 3. No teacher at an established Lower Cape School shall be rejected. The jury may, if necessary, ask for a work other than the one submitted by the teacher. Any uncertainties of the jury in this regard are to be referred to the Vice-Presidents for a decision.
- 4. There will be two alternates for each jury.
- 5. There will be no public discussion of any jury action.
- 6. Officers of the Association, the Director and members of the juries will be included in exhibitions without jury action.
- There will be a Hanging Committee chosen by the jury, to consist of one member of the jury plus one Vice-President.
- The jury will accept the largest number of works possible to fill the available space.
- 9. No painting will be accepted higher than 72" or wider than 50", exclusive of frame. No sculpture will be accepted heavier than 100 pounds or that cannot be handled by one person.
- Only one work, irrespective of medium, may be submitted to the jury by each member.
- 11. The jury may require an exhibiter to change a frame, if it votes to do so.
- 12. These instructions to juries are to be posted in the Association at all times.
- These instructions to juries are to be reviewed annually by the Vice-Presidents.
