



Art raises record funds for civil rights

"Artists for CORE" (Congress of Racial Equality) will hold its third annual sale of paintings and sculptures donated by prominent artists on May 6-12 at the galleries of the American Federation of Arts after a benefit preview on May 5. Co-chairmen of the committee, painter Raymond Parker and Lloyd Goodrich, director of the Whitney Museum, announced that last year's show netted over \$40,000—becoming one of the most successful fund-raising projects ever undertaken by artists (last year's co-chairmen were painter Kyle Morris and ARTNEWS' Alfred Frankfurter). Among the first artists to contribute their work to the show are: Milton Avery, Jim Dine, David Hare, Grace Hartigan, Hans Hofmann, Robert Indiana, Elaine de Kooning, Jacob Lawrence, Marisol, Robert Motherwell and Fairfield Porter.
