SATURDAY NIGHT during the storm when winds were clocked almost at 50 miles an hour a rare box elder tree of the maple family that is in the front yard of the house of Mrs. Grace Rutherford at 524 Commercial Street was practically split in half, according to Miss Helen Richards. The tree was planted by the mother of Edwin Welden, who died about ten years ago, and if he were alive now would be in his nineties, which makes the tree nearly 150 years old. Mrs. Rutherford, who owns the house now and lives here during the Summer is the great-niece of Mr. Welden. It is the same house in which Admiral MacMillan was born.
