

CAPTAIN JACK'S WHARF PROVIDES CAPE END ATMOSPHERE

Not many of the guests who stay in the assortment of studios and apartments that ramble out along the wharf, know that there actually was a Captain Jack. Capt. Jack Williams, who died about 22 years ago, bought, sold and cured fish on the wharf for many years, and afterwards ran the place as a "home away from home" for tourists and artists.
