## SELECTMEN MAKE NO LEASE OF WHARF TO STEEL PIER CO.

Meeting of Business Men Show Opinion Strongly Opposed To Tying Up Town Wharf To Cape Cod Steamship Co.

Provincetown's Board of Selectmen is evidently being guided in granting the request of the Cape Cod Steamship Company for an exclusive three year lease of the town pier, by sentiment against such a lease voiced by many businessmen and women at a special meeting of the selectmen and over fifty merchants in the Board of Trade Building Tuesday morning. At one o'clock today, the Board had not leased Railroad Wharf to the owners of the S. S. Steel Pier or to any other Company.

Selectman N. Edwin Lewis, opposing those in favor of granting such a lease declared, "I feel that the wharf is the property of the people of Provincetown, and therefore should not be exclusively leased to any one. In the past, exclusive leases have cost the town a considerable loss of revenue from the wharf."
