More Received In Gifts

Over \$700 has already been received for memorial gifts for the new Provincetown Methodist Church. The church's goal is \$5,000 for complete furnishings. The memorial gift booklets recently mailed out have met with considerable results. As the nave of the church nears completion the decision has been made by the trustees-building committee with the approval of the architect to maintain the beautiful redwood interior work of the nave in its natural beauty.

Nearly all of the lighting fixtures are installed and ready for use. Visitors are welcome at any time during the day while workmen are present and at any other time when the pastor or others are present. Many folks from out-of-town as well as in the community have taken advantage of visiting the building which undoubtedly is the most complete church facility of its kind on Cape Cod.

Church Grounds Befriended

Another unexpected boost has been given to the grounds of the new Provincetown Methodist Church when within the past week more than 60 loads of fill has been donated to the church. The work is being done by Tinkham Construction Company, and actual grading of the grounds and parking area is fast taking shape. Within a short time part of the parking area will be ready for use. A much larger number of cars will be able to be parked than was originally believed.

Methodists Start Using New Church

A special "kick-off" Rally Day service will feature Sunday's 11 a.m. service at Provincetown Methodist Church. The special service will be held in the Parish Hall of the new church on Shank-painter Road. The finishing touches to the Parish Hall are being made this week prior to its use on Sunday.

The special Rally Day service will officially begin the activities for the Fall and Winter at the church. Sermon topic chosen for the occasion by the pastor is entitled, "Like A Mighty Army." Special music will be arranged. There will be baby-sitting service during church time. George Baker will be in charge of ushers Comm. W.W. McKellar is in charge of hospitality. Services will be held regularly in the Parish Hall of the new church until the church nave itself is ready.

EVENTUALLY they may have to issue luncheon cards for the weekly mid-day meals every Thursday in the Parish House of the new Methodist Church because every week the attendance increases, and why not. Today we had roast chicken, scalloped potatoes, chop suey, three kinds of salad, pigs-in-blankets, brown rice, macaroni, several kinds of vegetables, corn bread and a half-dozen kinds of dessert—home-made cakes, pies and puddings. The tables were filled and the beauty is that people don't feel impelled to dress but drop in on their lunch hour, right from work.

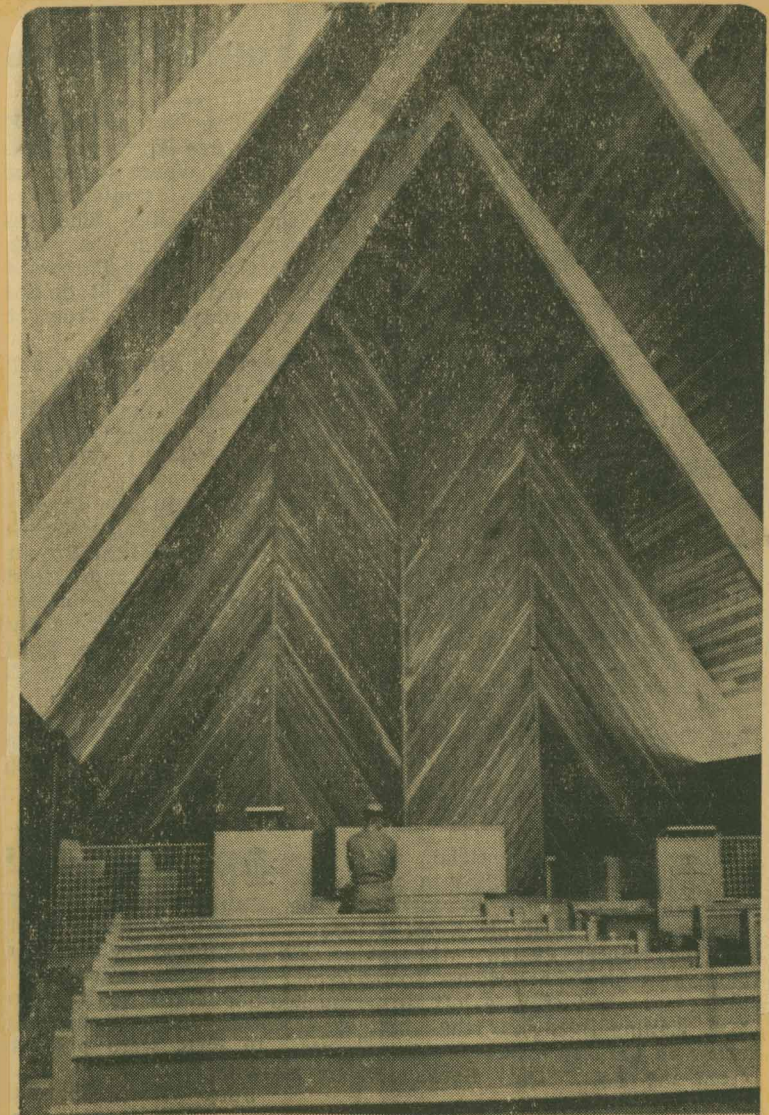
