Funeral Today For Frank A. Days

Frank A. Days, Jr., 84, formerly of Provincetown, and a native of the town, died early Monday in a Cambridge hospital. He had been in ill health for some time.

Mr. Days retired several years ago from F. A. Days and Company which he had headed for many years. He had been living with his son, Lawrence A. Days of Belmont for several years before his death.

Educated in the Provincetown schools he went to work with his father in the contracting business and it was his firm that built Provincetown High School in the early 1930s.

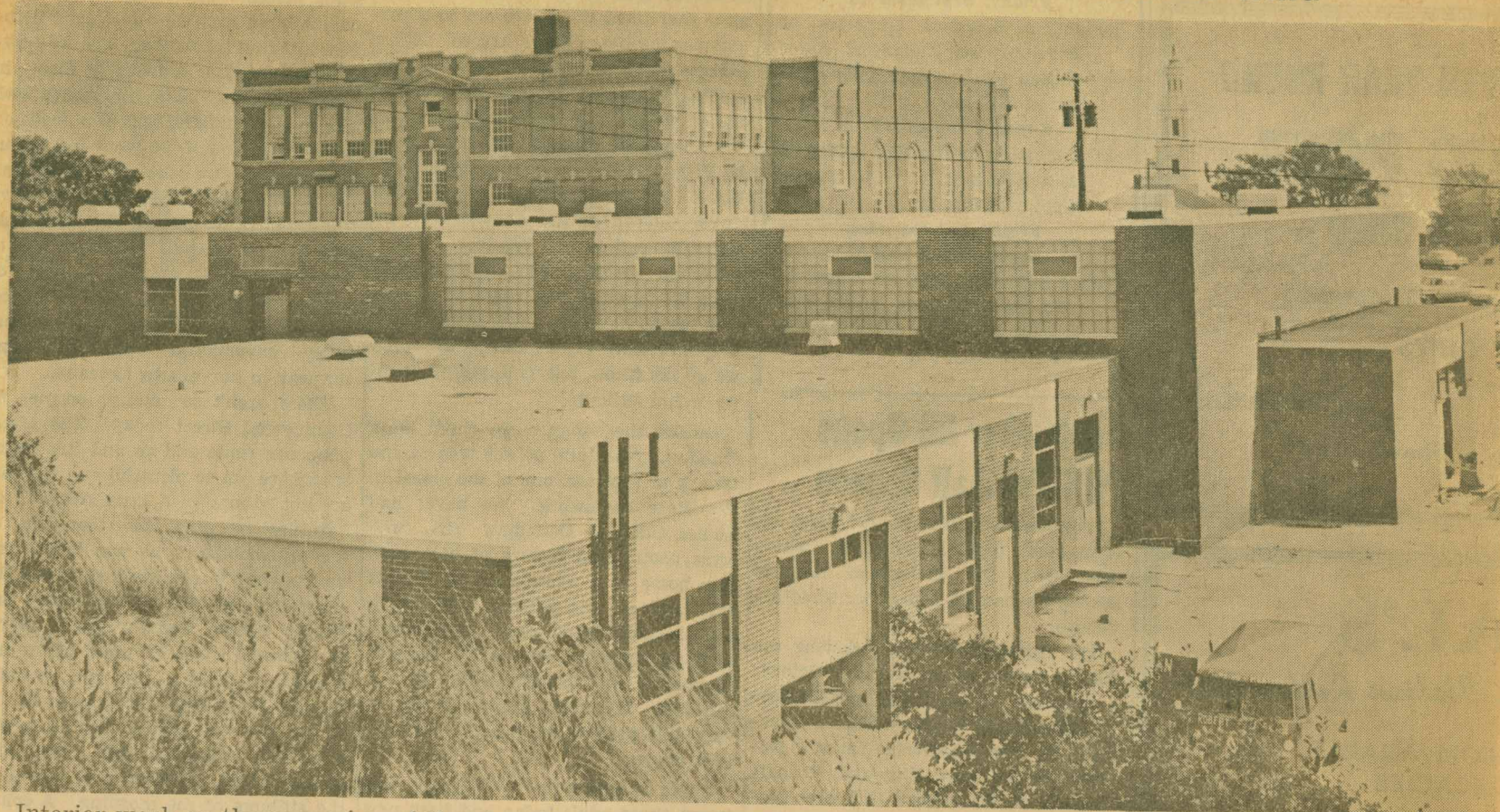
His former home on Court Street here is now a convent and was named in memory of his wife, who died several years ago.

Mr. Days was a communicant of the Church of St. Peter the Apostle, a member of Walter Welsh Council, Knights of Columbus, and of St. Peter's Holy Name Society. He was a life member of the Provincetown Art Association.

Survivors include four sons, Francis E. of Provincetown; Raymond A. of North Truro; Leonard W. of California, and Lawrence A. of Belmont, with whom he made his home. Other survivors are two daughters, Anna, now Sister Mary Leander of St. James Convent, New Bedford, and Mrs. Mary Hartman of California; three brothers, Joseph A. Days and William Days, both of Provincetown, and Stephen A. Days of Bourne; a sister, Mrs. Emma Curran of Provincetown, and several grandchildren, nieces and nephews.

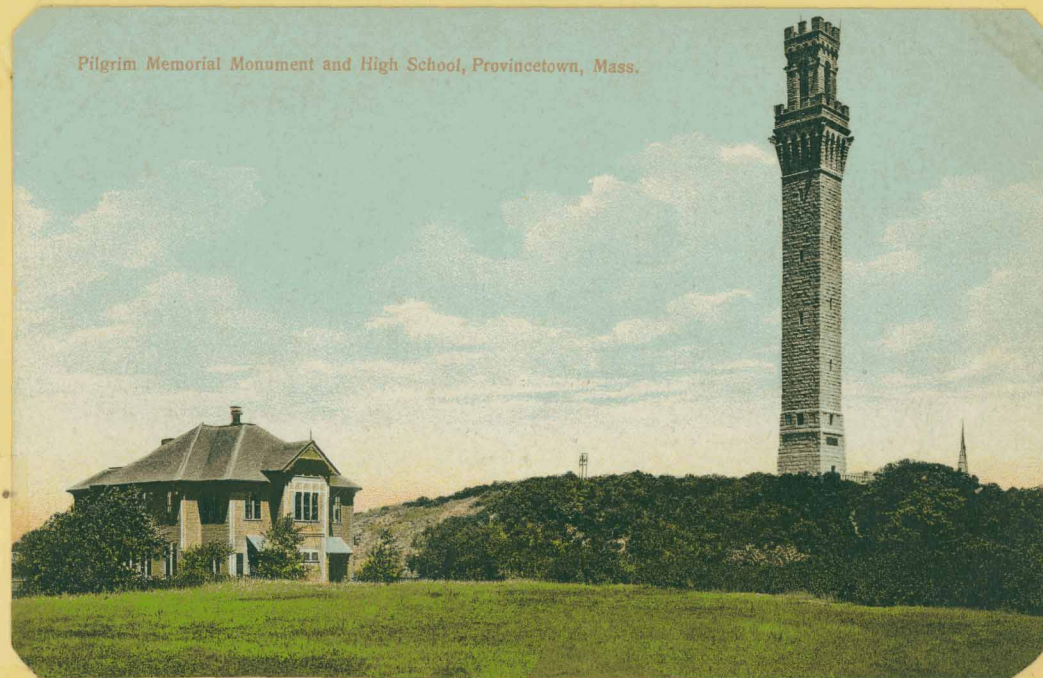
Solemn High Mass of Requiem was at 10 o'clock this morning at the Church of St. Peter the Apostle and interment was in St. Peter's Cemetery.
