### Former Martha's Vineyard Vessel To Operate Here This Summer

Town Manager Robert Hancock said at a press conference Tuesday that Joseph T. Gelinis of Hyannis, president of the Island Steamship Lines, Inc., has announced that he will operate the excursion vessel "Martha's Vineyard" between here and Boston this Summer.

Mr. Hancock said actual date of the start of the run had not been announced but gave it as his own guess that the "Martha's Vineyard" would probably begin operating the weekend of July 4th. The 210-foot vessel can carry 1100 passengers. In Boston it will dock at Long Wharf, foot of State Street.

### "Martha's Vineyard" Will Not Run

A letter received from the Island Steamship Lines, Inc. by Town Manager Robert Hancock indicates that the vessel plying between Provincetown and Boston last Summer will not return next season. The vessel was principally owned by Theodore Gelinis, who formerly operated it out of Hyannis.

Financial losses in the operation were cited by the company's representatives, said Mr. Hancock.

Provincetown-Boston transportation by water may be provided by another firm, he said, but details are not yet available.
