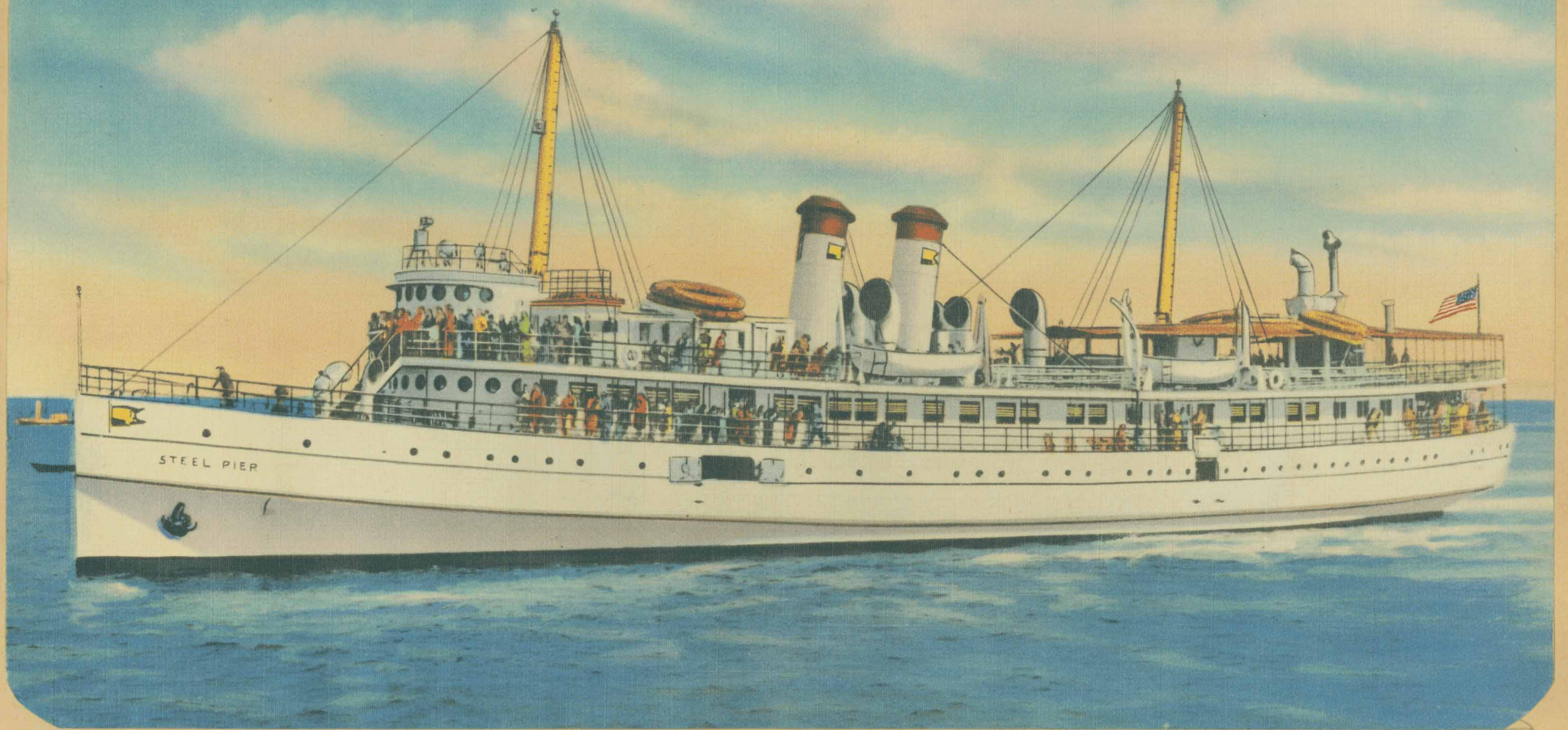


S. S. Steel Pier, Provincetown, Mass.

It would seem that old excursion steamers, like soldiers, never die. And it is also understood that the Boston-Provincetown Steamship Line has bought the S. S. Virginia Lee, reputed to be a craft both fast and staunch, for use on the Provincetown run next summer. A lot of Provincetown boys who served in the Navy know the Virginia Lee because she used to ply between Cape Charles, Virginia, and Norfolk and Little Creek. She was also used as a Navy training ship for a time and even made the Amazon River in the rubber trade.
