Water Reservoir On Mt. Gilboa Nears Completion

Rising four tiers high and expected to be completed about Christmas time is the new water reservoir being constructed on Mount Gilboa, just this side of Pilgrim Heights, in connection with the Town water renovation project which is being financed under the Area Redevelopment Program. Considerable time on the project was spent on the erection of the special structure seen in the middle of the picture above, on which crane-type devices work to raise the steel sections into position. When finished the tower will reach a lofty height of 90 feet. The spacious interior, shown above with workmen's staging, has a diameter of 81 feet and will have a capacity of three million gallons. A service road off Route 6A at Mayflower Heights leads directly to the tower.
