Arthur C. Patrick Dies Owner Of Newsstand

Services will be held tomorrow the Church of St. Peter the Apostle for Arthur C. Patrick, 69, of 306 Commercial Street, who died at the Cape Cod Hospital on Tuesday, August 9. Interment will be in St. Peter's Cemetery.

Mr. Patrick was born in Provincetown, the son of the late Joseph and Matilda (Tarvis) Patrick and lived here all his life. He was educated in local schools and attended Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island. He served in World War I, from 1918 to 1919 being discharged with rank of corporal.

Returning to Provincetown he worked for his father in the newsstore and upon his father's death became owner of Patricks Newsmorning (Friday), at 9 a.m., at stand, operating the business until his death.
