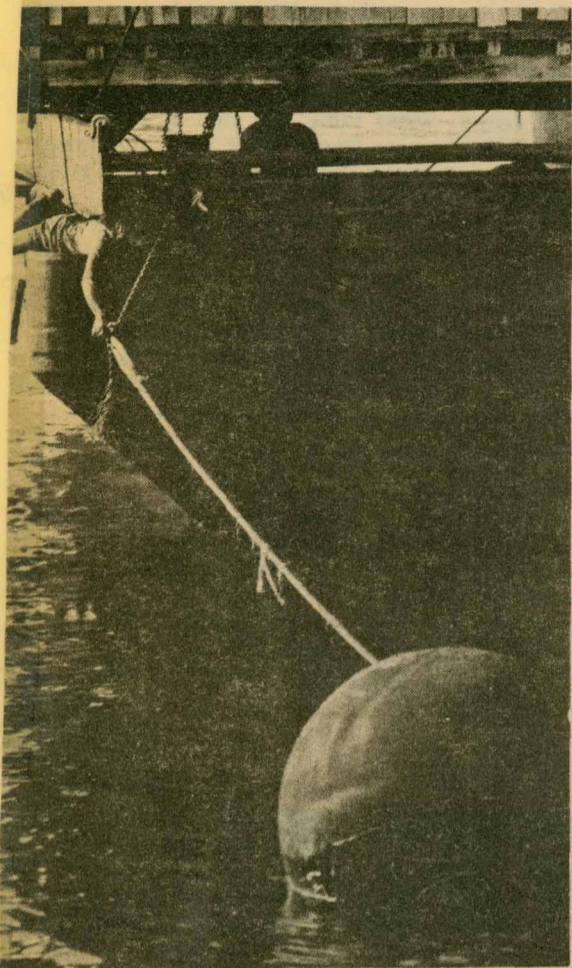


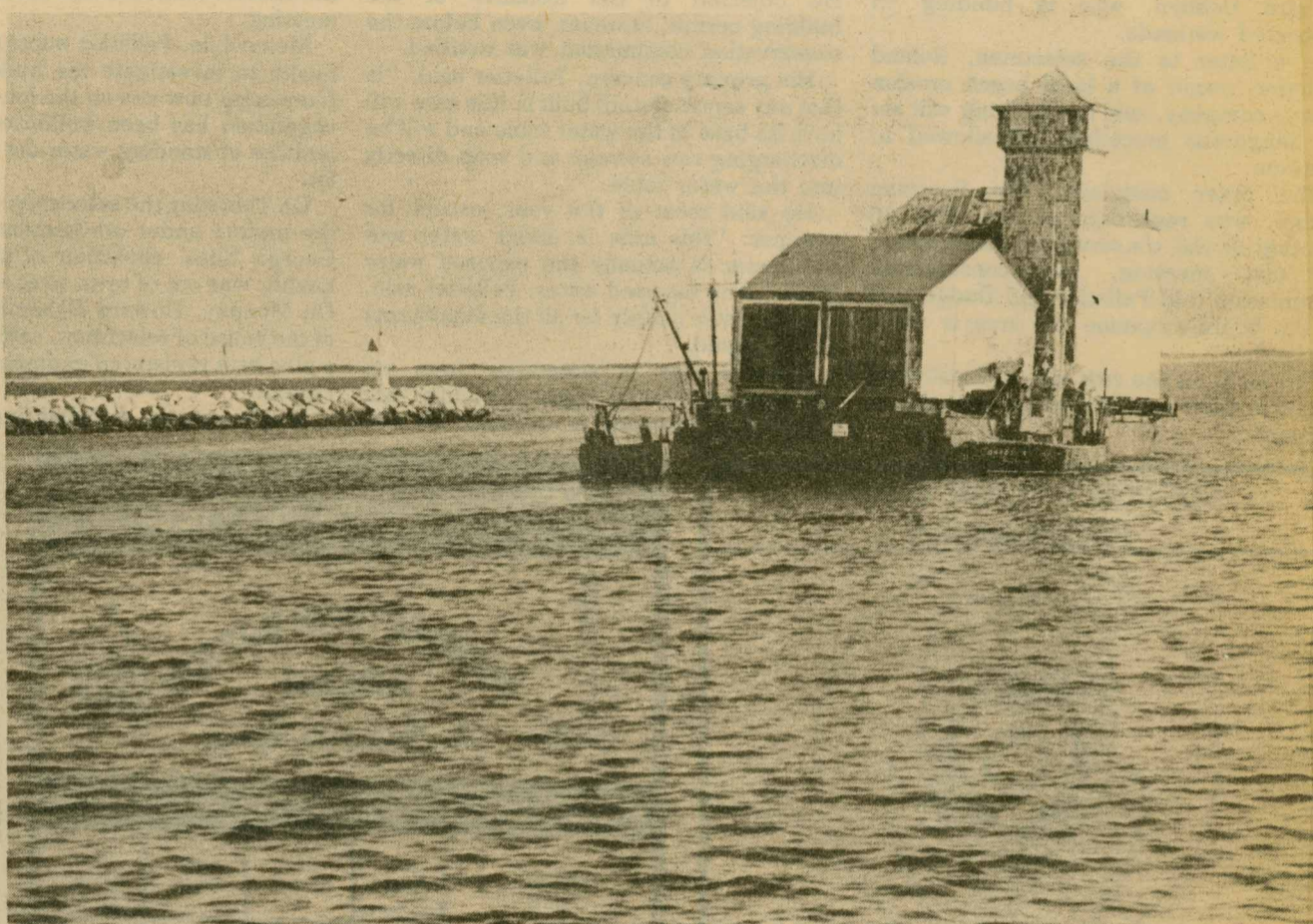

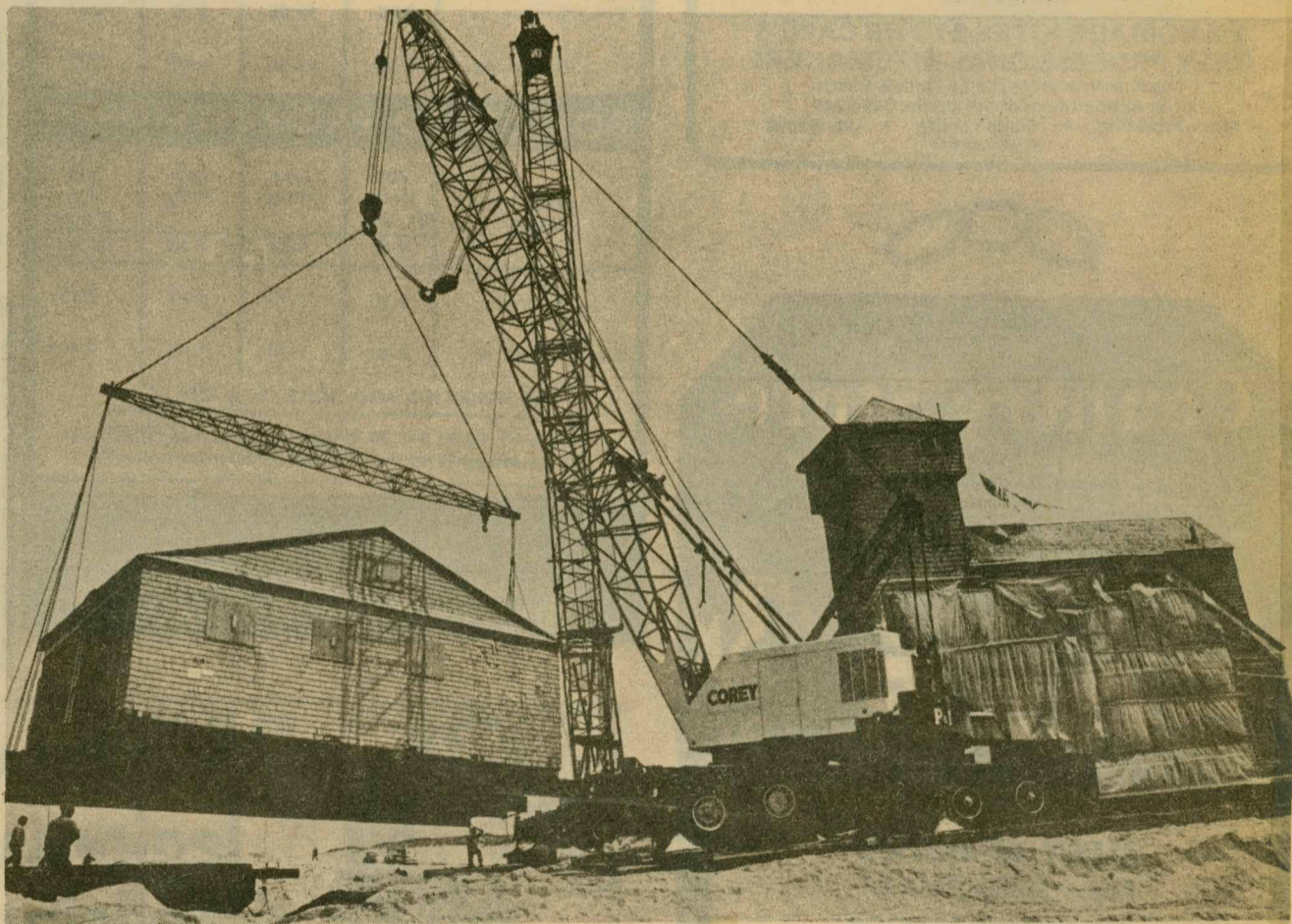

The last move

Two giant cranes lifted the Old Harbor Coast Guard Station for what should be the last time Monday.

The building had been placed on an incomplete foundation following its move from Provincetown Harbor two weeks ago. It rested on steel beams on cribbing above the foundation.

For the last two weeks, workers have been building up the foundation to the level of the Old Harbor station. Monday it was lifted and the steel beams removed. It was lowered on its new foundation.
