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### ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

6 Whorf's Court is a 1-1/2-story, 3-bay dwelling on a raised brick foundation. The roof has partial cornice returns, a brick chimney at the ridge, and skylights in the roof slope. Wood stairs and deck lead to wood panel door with storms. Windows are generally 2/2 DHS - some are replacements. Applied louvered shutters are present. A secondary entrance is located at the basement level of the primary facade. A deck accesses a secondary entry on the rear facade (north). A 3/3 DHS window is directly adjacent to the door; gable end windows are 6/6 DHS. Basement windows are single-light or glass block.
