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### ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

*Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.*

At intersection of Tremont Street, 1 1/2-story, 3-bay side entry section with a shed dormer in side gable roof creating 2nd story. Adjacent section to south is 2 stories with a 1-story section at the south end, with 1/1 DHS windows. Octagonal windows are located on gable ends. A roof deck is located above the 1-story section. Primary facades are clad in clapboard, and secondary facades are clad in wood shingles. 1/1 DHS are present on the rear of the building. A stairway is located between the southern end of the block at Tremont Street and a recent section with poured concrete foundation at south end is 2 stories, central entry, 1/1 DHS windows. The former 3/4 cottage at this location is not evident.
