Obscured on all sides by tall fence; Mechanic Street side: 2-story, very irregular building; asphalt roof shingles; 1/1 wood DHS with inoperable louvered shutters; 2nd floor deck with exterior steps; multi-entrances. Cottage Street side: shed dormers with 6-panel wood awnings; interior brick chimney; 1/1 vinyl DHS. Connected to gambrel roof is a 2-story building with gable dormers, 1/1 vinyl DHS and inoperable shutters.
