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### ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

9 Whorf's Court is a 2-story, 3-bay, 1/2 cottage; roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; partial cornice returns; interior brick ridge chimney; exterior is clad in wood shingles on the front façade, with clapboard siding on secondary facades; raised basement; fenestration includes 2/2 wood DHS throughout with wood surrounds; primary entrance has modern pane-and-panel door with flat wood surround; entrance is reached by modern wood steps from north side; basement access on front facade by wood pane-and-panel door and steps; rear ell has clapboard siding, 6/2 wood DHS, 2-pane wood awning basement window, pane-and-panel wood basement entry; pane-and-panel access to 1st floor but door suspended with no exit access; parged brick interior chimney.
