128A Commercial Street is a 2-story Colonial Revival-style dwelling; side-gable roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, stuccoed interior end brick chimney; exterior is clad in wood shingles with wood trim, building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes 1/1 and 6/1 vinyl DHS, octagonal window in 2nd story; primary entrance accessed by multi-light door with 3-light sidelights in center bay, brick stoop; deck; 1-story shed-roof addition with a 2nd-story deck accessed by exterior wood steps extends from the rear façade; house also accessed by a 2nd-story pane-and-panel door and sliding glass doors.
