The outbuilding at 18 Pleasant St. is a 2-story garage/cottage; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles; concrete block exterior chimney on north end; exterior is clad in wood shingles; 1-car garage on 1st floor with overhead modern fiberglass door; slight 2nd-floor overhang on east and west facade; fenestration includes 6/6 wood DHS; east façade contains entrance to cottage with modern storm door; deck and steps access 2nd floor and connect to 2nd floor of house.
