2-story, 3-bay former sidehall cottage converted to multi-unit residence; front-gable roof has partial cornice returns, brick chimney at roof ridge, skylights; shed dormer on south slope; secondary entry at rear of main block on south façade; West facade now has entry at 2nd story, accessed by wood exterior steps; Windows are replacement 1/1 DHS; 1/1 DHS on north facade, except 1 octagonal window; 1-story addition at rear has roof deck above.
