2 Winthrop Place is a 2-story, 3-bay sidehall dwelling facing north; raised entry with no access to front door (steps missing) - just modern wood balcony with square wood balustrade and latticework skirting; pane-and-panel aluminum door with flanking pilasters and 5-pane sidelights and entablature top; fenestration includes 1/1 DHS vinyl with wood lintel; full cornice return; frieze board; gable and shed dormer on east roof slope; basement entry on west side; brick and concrete block interior chimney; full 2-story addition at rear with exterior steps to several entrances .
