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ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

10 Prince Street is a 2-story, 3-bay sidehall entry dwelling. Front-gable roof has partial returns, frieze below eaves; central brick chimney at ridge. Shed dormer on north slope. Main entry - pane-and-panel door with storm. Shallow shed hood with end brackets. Brick stoop. Windows - 2/2 wood with wood surrounds. 1-story rear ell with brick chimney at gable roof ridge. 1-story hyphen between this and main block. Secondary entry here with pane-and-panel door and storm, 2/2 DHS and 2-light casement. Open porch on hyphen with square posts and aluminum-clad half wall.
