16 Prince Street is a 1-1/2-story, 4-bay, 3/4 cottage. Side-gable roof with gable dormer on front and shed dormer on rear. Main entry - panel door with storm; sidelights; wood surround with entablature; brick stoop. Windows - 6/6 replacement vinyl DHS with simple wood surrounds. 1-story gable-roof rear ell with 6/6 DHS and paired casement windows. Concrete block chimney at end. 2nd entry on south facade.
