8 Webster Place is a 1-1/2-story dwelling with large shed dormer across front roof slope creating 2nd story. Raised basement with entrance. Exterior end brick chimney on east end. Exterior wood stair to main central entrance, which contains a pane-and-panel door with simple surround. Fenestration includes 2/2 and 4/4 vertically divided DHS wood windows with wood trim.
