3 Webster Place is a 1-1/2-story, 3-bay, sidehall cottage; gable-front roof has asphalt shingles and partial cornice returns; fenestration includes 6/6 DHS wood, 8/8 DHS wood; primary entrance is accessed by pane-and-panel historic door with oval pane and modern storm, door surround has flanking pilasters, 4-pane sidelights and heavy entablature; brick stoop; bay on south with hipped roof clad in shingles; 1-story section on rear facade.
