ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

1 1/2-story, 3-bay sidehall cottage; faces south; brick chimney on west roof slope; main entrance contains a historic double-leaf arched- pane and panel doors with flat hood supported by end brackets; secondary entry with similar details as main entrance including single-leaf door and storm hood and brackets, accessed by wood step; fenestration includes 1/1 replacement vinyl DHS with louvered shutters, square bay on west façade; 1 1/2-story addition at north end; secondary entrance on west facade and basement of north façade; Wood deck between entrances on west façade; shed dormers on addition.
