24 Standish Street is a 1-1/2-story, 3-bay, gable end with 2-bay side ell dwelling. Corbelled brick chimney on front (ell) roof slope. Fanlight and panel door with storm is central on façade; wood surround; wood ramp to door. Windows include 6/6 and 2/2 wood DHS; paired 6-light casements present on south gable end. Small decorative rafter ends below side gable eaves.
