34 Standish Street is a 2-story, 4-bay sidehall entry residence. Side-gable roof has partial cornice returns and frieze under eaves; large shed dormers on front and rear slopes create 3rd story. Pane-and-panel entrance with pedimented crown. Windows include replacement 1/1 DHS with storms. 1 Chicago-style picture window in front dormer with 1/1 DHS. Similar in rear dormer with multi-pane and 4/4 DHS. Telescoping 2-story and 1-story gable-roof additions create rear ell. Enclosed 1-story porch fills corner between main block and 2-story addition.
