358-360 Commercial St. is a 2-1/2-story, 3-bay Greek Revival-style dwelling; gable-front roof is sheathed in asphalt shingles, full cornice return, shed dormers on side roof slopes; exterior is clad in clapboard siding with wood trim; building sits on a brick foundation; fenestration includes 2/2 wood DHS, windows have simple surrounds, paired 2/2 DHS windows in gable end, storm windows installed; primary entrance has an entablature supported by pilasters and 6-light sidelights; corner pilasters with capitals; storm doors installed; ell addition; secondary entrance with small hood.
