9 Pearl St. is a 2-story, 3-bay by 7-bay; roof clad in asphalt shingles; 2 interior brick chimneys at peak; partial return, fascia board and corner boards; main entrance not visible; secondary entrance on south side at rear section with jalousie door and concrete block deck; 1/1 vinyl DHS; exterior stair to 2nd floor porch/entrance on south side; rear (east) 2-story shed roof addition with 2nd floor overhang; 1st floor creating porch on 1st.
