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### ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

565 Commercial St. is composed of two attached buildings. First building is a 1-1/2-story bungalow; side-gable roof is sheathed in wood shingles; exterior end and interior slope brick chimneys; exterior is clad in wood shingles; fenestration includes paired and single 2/2 wood DHS; primary entrance is accessed by original pane-and-panel wood door; building incorporates 2-car garage on gable end; garage has historic wood pane-and-panel folding doors. Second building is 2 stories and faces south side; cross-gable roof is sheathed in wood shingles and has exposed rafter tails; shed dormer; exterior brick chimney; exterior is clad in wood shingles; fenestration includes 2/2 wood DHS, 2/1 wood DHS, and 3/1 wood DHS; entry details not visible from street.
