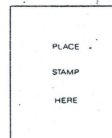
### № 17 Provincetown Inn, 1935

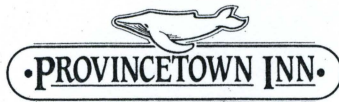
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### Nº6 Commercial Street

Up until 1835, when Front Street was laid out, Provincetown had no streets. Residents used the beach for all traffic. Now called Commercial Street, this scene depicts how it looked at the turn of the century, looking west at the corner of Standish, at the center of town.

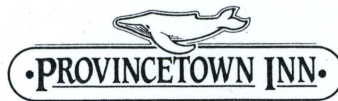
