

Tirca Karlis To Show Gross Paintings

A one man show of recent paintings by Sidney Gross, will open July 24 at the Tirca Karlis Gallery. Mr. Gross, a well known New York painter is represented there by the Frank K. M. Rehn Gallery since 1946. He has had eleven one-man shows in New York and this will be his second show at the Tirca Karlis Gallery in Provincetown.

His work is represented in the permanent collections of the Whitney Museum (two paintings), the Corcoran Gallery, the Baltimore Museum, the Washington Gallery of Modern Art, the University of Illinois, Columbia University, the Chrysler Museum, the Butler Art Institute (two paintings), Cornell University's White Museum, the Riverside Museum (two paintings), Colby College, the University of Georgia, Mr. Holyoke College, the University of Omaha, Brandeis University, Morgan State College, the Standard

Financial Corp. (four paintings) and has twenty paintings in the Lempert Foundation. Mr. Gross has had paintings purchased twice, by the American Academy of Arts and Letters via the Childe Hassam Fund.

Paintings by Sidney Gross have been exhibited in all the major national shows including The Metropolitan, the Whitney Museum, the Carnegie Institute, the Corcoran Gallery, the Museum of Modern Art, the Pennsylvania Academy, the Virginia Museum, the Butler Art Institute, Art U.S.A., etc. His work has also been exhibited in Europe, South America and Puerto Rico.

In 1949 Sidney Gross won a Tiffany Fellowship and a Hallmark Art Award; and in 1958 a Grand Prize at the Art U.S.A. exhibition. He has been teaching in New York at the Art Students League and Columbia University.
