

In Council Oct<sup>r</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> 1714

The Report of the Committee for running the line  
between Truro & the province land at Cape Codd viz

pursuant to an order of the Great & General Court or assembly  
begun & held at Boston the 26<sup>th</sup> day of May 1714. we the  
subscribers being appointed a committee, have made  
search & Enquiry for the True bounds, or line of dis-  
-sion, between the lands belonging to the proprietors of  
the Town of Truro, & the province land at Cape Codd. &  
with the assistance of the select Men of said Truro, have  
fixed & settled the said line as followeth. viz; Beginning at the  
easterly end of a Cliff near the cape harbour called by the Indians  
Meeconoyet & by the English Cormorant Hill at a jaw bone of a  
Whale set in the ground there, by the side of a Red oak stump  
& thence running by 2 marked ranged Trees, near on a north  
by west line, about half a point more westerly to a marked  
pine Tree standing by a weedy pond called by the Indians  
wooknotchysisset & from thence by marked range of Trees  
to a high hill on the back side near the north sea with a Red  
cedar post set in the said hill, & thence to run in the same line  
to the sea, & running back on the contrary line to the harbour  
Thomas Paine Esq<sup>r</sup> & Zedekiah Lumbart agents for said prop-  
-tors were present & consenting thereto - as witness our hands  
hereto set the 24<sup>th</sup> day of Sep<sup>r</sup> Anno Domi 1714.
