

WHAT TO DO AND SEE IN PROVINCETOWN

- Tablet marking the first landing place of the Pilgrims,—at the West End.
- The Pilgrim Memorial Monument—commemorating the first landing place of the Pilgrims.
- Bas-Relief “Signing of the Compact”—at the base of the Monument Hill.
- Flagship, a good place to eat—headquarters for charcoal broiled food, particularly lobsters. Open from Noon. Cocktail bar.
- Lipton Cup, presented the Rose Dorothea, in the Fishermen’s Race—in Town Hall.
- Paintings by Mr. Halsall and Mr. Hawthorne, and the Moffett Mural—in Town Hall.
- Smorgasbord every Sunday Evening at the SEA HORSE INN.
- Visit the old fish shack, which has been made over into a club house for the Beachcombers, the male members of the local art colony.
- Seven mile drive leaving Commercial Street at West End, continuing through dunes and going along Massachusetts Bay, (excellent Bathing Beach), connecting with State Highway.
- Fishing Fleet and daily arrival of Boston Boat at Town Pier.
- Beautiful Church of St. Mary’s of the Harbor, Commercial Street, East End.
- Beachcombers Costume Ball—late July.
- Sailing and fishing parties — leaving Town Wharf daily.
- Blessing of the Fishing Fleet.
- The Pilgrim Spring, near Pilgrim Heights, where the Pilgrims drank their first New World water.
- State Bathhouse at New Beach. Transportation by local bus.
- Historical Museum, 230 Commercial Street, maintained by The Research Club. Don’t fail to see Commander Donald B. MacMillan’s Arctic Collection.
- Universalist Church, — with Christopher Wren tower and old frescoing.
- See and talk to the Town Crier.
- Art Association Exhibition of paintings, July and August.
- Lighthouse and fog bell at Long Point, lighthouse and Coast Guard Station at Wood End, and Lighthouse, Fog Horn and Coast Guard Station at Race Point.
- Picturesque Provincetown Playhouse on the water at Gosnold Street—next to Sea Horse Inn.
- The Flagship, — Provincetown’s picturesque and famous Night Club. Rendezvous for artists and writers. Open until 1 A. M.
- Studios of nationally known writers and artists.
- Art Association Costume Ball—late August.
- Oldest house in Provincetown — at 72 Commercial Street.
- Enter Bass Derby — get information at Chamber of Commerce.
