The collection of war posters recently exhibited in Town Hall was loaned to the Provincetown Art Association by Mr. William E. Atwood of East Gloucester. Mr. Atwood is that rare and very happy combination, a man of means who also paints. He has benefited East Gloucester by building an Art Museum, and every summer they have a picture show, and a permanent collection is begun. Last year the sales amounted to five thousand dollars.

Knowing that the Aladdins help the artists who have first helped themselves, the Provincetown Art Association has bought a property for the surely coming Aladdin to build upon. If he doesn't, they will, as surely, do it themselves. They'll do it more quickly if the people of Provincetown will give their help. To become a member of the Art Association costs only a dollar a year, and willingness to belong is the only requirement. The Association has bought the Bangs property on Commercial Street, opposite the frontage and wharf recently acquired by the Beachcombers. The dream builds easily—the water front cleared, the wide steps to a Colonial portal, a thing of pride to the townspeople.

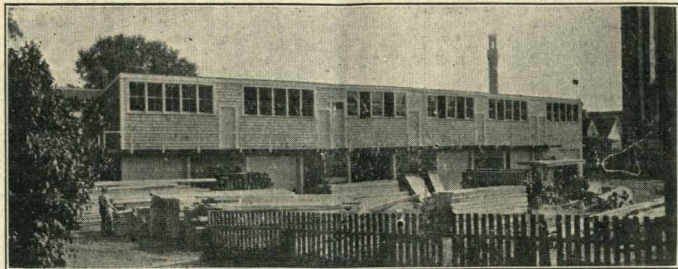

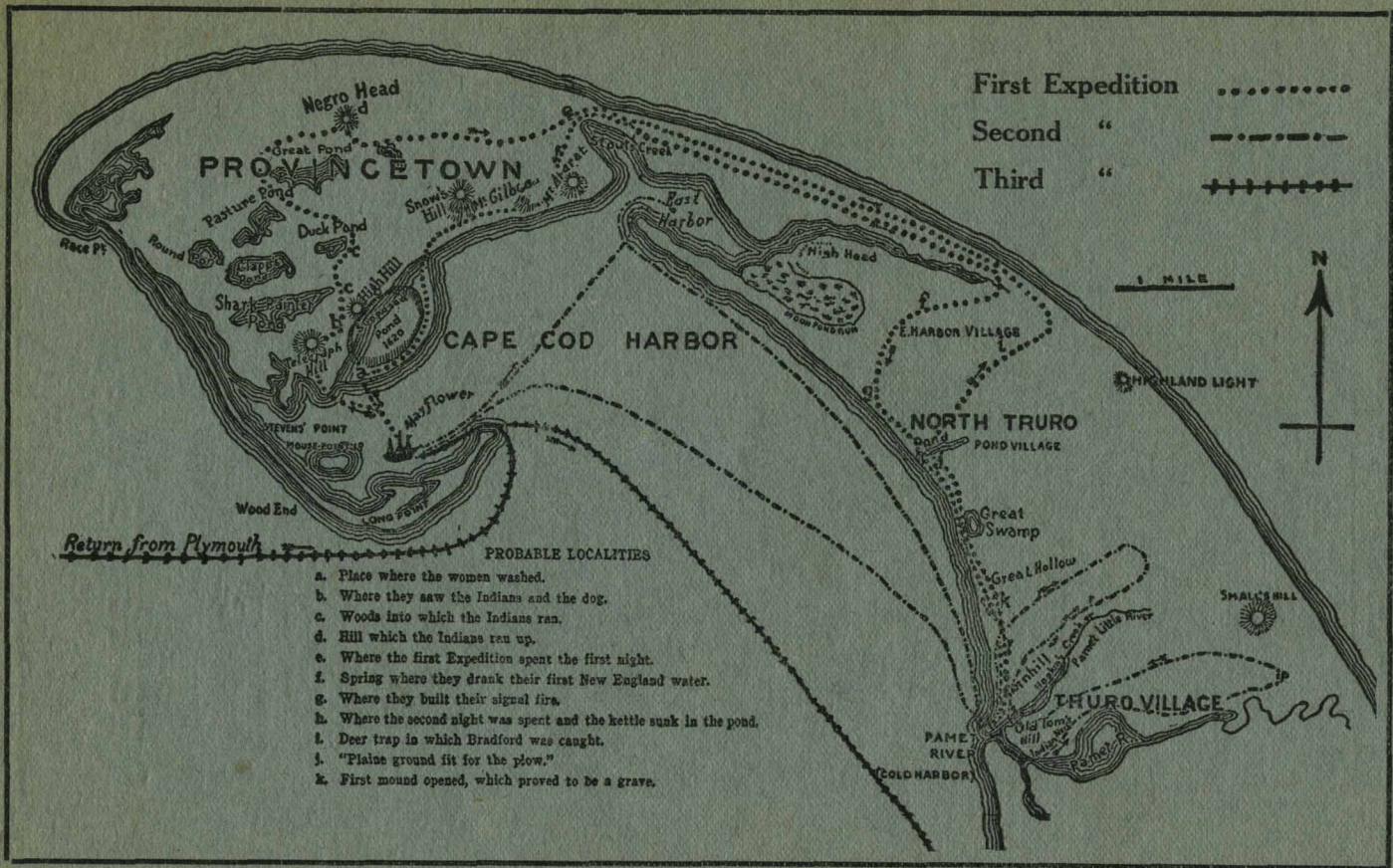
