

Quaint and beautiful Provincetown, a seacoast vacation city, looks out on the Atlantic Ocean from the tip of Cape Cod, Massachusetts.

To get to Provincetown, you travel down the Cape for eighty miles, going farther and farther out into the sea, farther and farther into coolness and quiet, or you take a spic and span boat from Boston and go all the way by water.

Provincetown, as every schoolboy knows, was the first landing place of the Pilgrims. Off in its great harbor, the passengers of the "Mayfloure", signed the notable Compact, our first Constitution; and these famous events recorded in monument and tablet in the

heart of the city, should be seen by all visitors. But these are not the most important reasons for coming to Provincetown. Provincetown is a place to rest and play.

The historic monument looks down on a far flung bathing beach where blue breakers wash gently on miles of soft clean sand. Along the town's bright shore line, are modern hotels with city orchestras, and quiet flower covered little inns, and gay Cape Cod cottages all in the business of making the vacationist happy and comfortable.

Up and down the narrow winding streets, back in the town, and down near the wharves, nearly every Provincetown housewife rents her pretty rooms in the

Set neatly and conveniently among the colorful summer shops are dozens of enchanting tea rooms and quaint places specializing in fish which, of course, is the main attraction of a seacoast town where sea food is brought in by busy little schooners long before you are up every morning.


These are the things you probably don't know about Provincetown. How its business from May to October and, as long as you care to stay thereafter, is to please

How To Get To Cool Provincetown

By train from Boston—Two trains daily to Provincetown.

- By automobile from Boston—Via Route 28 or Route 3 connecting with Route 6. Three hours from Boston.
- By steamship from Boston—Bay State Line and Cape Cod Steamship Co. direct to Provincetown; return same day or stop-over.
- By automobile from Providence—Connecting with New York and Eastern routes, take Route 6.

By bus from New Bedford, Mass.

- By airplane—Mayflower Air Lines from Boston, Plymouth, Hyannis to Provincetown's new flying field.

Things To Do In Beautiful Provincetown

First, of course, visit the Pilgrim Monument for gorgeous view of the harbor and town.

Historical Museum on Front Street, for Arctic Collection of Commander Donald MacMillan, notable resident of Provincetown; also fascinating exhibits of "scrimshaw," objects made from bones and teeth of whales, enchanting costumes, shells.

Fishing Freezers on Front Street. These places, busy in the summer, do not welcome visitors but poke around as much as they will allow you because this is an interesting and important business.

Oldest House in Town in the West End.

Also at West End, place where the tidy Pilgrim women did their washing on their first day ashore.

See the Airport of which we are very proud.

Race Point and Wood End Light. To reach these take new state road around the most beautiful sand dunes in America.

Bathing beach five minutes from town extends five miles along shore. Safe, level and the perfect playground for children.
