On May 13, Knoedler & Company will host a reception to benefit the Provincetown Art Association and Museum. Established in 1914, PAAM has served dual purposes as a collecting museum and a professional artists' association. The collection of more than 1,700 works has been the basis for numerous exhibitions and has served scholars, researchers, and other organizations. Continuing a tradition established by its founders, PAAM is one of very few museums where artists themselves are responsible for the selection of exhibitions.

Recent exhibitions have offered the work of Hans Hofmann, Lester Johnson, Blanche Lazzelle, Paul Resika, and E. Ambrose Webster. The coming season will include a salon-style presentation of the collection, both juried and open shows of members' work, and shows featuring James Gahagan, Hank Jensen, Candy Jernigan, George McNeil, Mel Roman, and Nora Speyer.

PAAM has been a vital source for contemporary exhibitions, as well as a human resource for workshops, classes, lectures, performances, and demonstrations. During the winter months, PAAM's youth education program offers local elementary and high school students the opportunity to select, curate, and comment on exhibitions drawn from the permanent collection.

This season will see the inauguration of a new program at PAAM's Herman and Mary Robinson School, which will bring a fresh approach to a traditional way of teaching art.
