THEATRE WORKSHOP WILL DEDICATE  
NEW PROVINCETOWN PLAYS TO FORMER  
SELECTMAN, ~~FRANK HENDERSON~~

Two new, original play-scripts authored by members of the Provincetown Theatre Workshop will be presented at the Provincetown Art Association on Friday and Saturday evenings, April 10th and April 11th at 8 P.M. as a memorial performance for Frankie Henderson who died suddenly on March 12th.

In an unprecedented gesture of co-operation and generosity, the Board of Directors of the Art Association has offered a temporary haven to the Workshop and the theatre group has moved in.

Hammers, saws and paintbrushes are flying for the sake of Theatres in halls hitherto dedicated to painting and the graphic arts.

Thus in its own way, Provincetown is emulating the late President Kennedy's dream of a renaissance and fusion of the arts-- to make art as much a part of community life as earthier requirements.

A movable stage is being built, which is designed to be taken down and removed from the premises whenever necessary, with the ability to cart it all back and set it up quickly for future use.



Carl Black portrays the artist, Sydney Buffington II plays his unpredictable friends - - an "enfant terrible", Jane Vanderburgh is a symbol of fresh hope. Others in the cast are Barbara Avellar, Connie Black, Norma Snow, Nicholas Wells, Reeves Euler, Ernest Vanderburgh, Moe Van Dereck, Salvatore Del Dec and Horace Snow, Jr.

Both plays have been directed by Jim Forsberg, assisted by Ray Martan Wells.

A group of loge seats will be occupied by "Sponsors" who ~~have~~ contributed \$5.00 per pair of seats. General admission is 99 cents - - and the public is asked to be unusually prompt for the early "NO-CURTAIN" at 8 P.M.
