



Tom Gladwell (Director) has directed many productions in New York, at theaters including La Mama. Ubu Repertory, New York Theater Workshop and Theatre for the New City. His most recent work includes directing new plays by John J. McLaughlin (Lycanthrope and Woof), Jane Edith Wilson (Train of Thought) and four world premiere productions written by Harry Kondoleon: The Little Book of Professor Enigma, The Convertible of Love, Half Off and The Housequests, which received the Obie Award for Best Play. In October of this year, Tom directed his first play in Provincetown, And Sophie Comes Too by Mervl Cohn, Mr. Gladwell has also directed numerous films, including Hand-Me-Downs, a dramatic feature which was nominated for an Academy Award and was honored by the Louis B. Mayer Foundation, Don Juan in New York, which was commissioned to accompany the world premiere production of Eduardo Machado's play of the same name, and The Witch, from the story by Shirley Jackson. He has directed several music videos and is the author of the screenplays Zivia's Secret and Atlanta. Mr. Gladwell studied acting at the Neighborhood Playhouse with Sanford Meisner and received a degree in film from New York University. He has been the recipient of creative grants from IBM, the Johnson Foundation and Mobil Corporation. Tom is pleased to be working again with the PTC and would particularly like to thank Patrick Casey for his enthusiastic collaboration. Mr. Gladwell dedicates his work on this production to Andy.

Braunwyn Jackett has worked extensively with PTC for the last 8 years. Her most recent performances were: *And Sophie Comes Too* by Meryl Cohn; and the title character in *Mrs. Bob Cratchit's Wild Christmas Binge.* Braunwyn is a native of Provincetown. She loves this theater company and gives many thanks to the talented Tom Gladwell for giving her this part and believing in her as an actress.

Andy Reynolds performed in many plays in New York City, including three world premiere productions by Harry Kondoleon (Lowell in *The Little Book of Professor Enigma*, Angus in *The Convertible of Love*, and Buddy in *Half Off*). He also played Mr. Kidd in *Monograms*, Marquis in *Woof* and Justin in *Like You Care* at the Ontological-Hysteric Theater, which he also co-wrote. He was seen in PTC's Spring Festival and most recently as Archer in Ed Valentine's *1001 Tricks* at the Fringe and as the Ghost in PTC's *Mrs. Bob Cratchit's Wild Christmas Binge*. He dedicates this performance to Tom.

Anne Reynolds was born in the Bronx in 1934, and attended the College of Mount Saint Vincent's and Fordham University. After raising eight children, she turned her attention to writing and gay rights activism. Her work was published in collections of poetry. She died in 2004, leaving behind a rich archive of poems, prose and non-fiction.

Kevin Shenk has "trod the boards" since the age of six. Her credits include over 800 live TV performances of Kraft Playhouse "Studio One" and a long running role on "A Brighter Day". She made her Broadway debut in the original production of *Inherit the Wind*. After a 22 year hiatus to raise her family, she returned to the stage for PTC in numerous works, including: *The Night of the Iguana; The Dining Room; Three by Tennessee, Fifth of July; Noises Off; Hot'l Baltimore,* and most recently, *A Yellow Light* and *Mrs. Bob Cratchit's Wild Christmas Binge*. She appeared last summer in the Payomet production of *Girls Who Wear Glasses*. She served for many years as President of the Board of PTC.

Jerry Thompson is a playwright appeared in PTC productions in 1980 in *Electra* and *Enter a Free Man* and more recently in *Mrs. Bob Cratchit's Wild Christmas Binge.*

THE VISUAL ARTIST

Geoffrey Chadsey is a second-year Fellow at the FAWC. His drawings have been shown in galleries and museums throughout the US, most recently in an exhibition of new work at Jack Shainman Gallery in New York.
