In real life he plays a hotel manager.

John Keller (Ben) has recently appeared in *My Three Angels* and *The Dresser* (Academy of Performing Arts, Orleans) and last summer's SEVEN SHORTS (*Eddy and Benny, Single Lives*) at the PTC. He thanks Candace for this play and this role, Bart for his insights, the other cast members for their tenacity and humor, and he gives special thanks to Larry for his unstinting help with this role and with all the other stuff in our life.

Laura Shabott (Hannah) has participated with the PTC since 1998. She will be performing in Eric Bogosian's one woman show, *Drinking in America*, as part of the Provincetown Film Festival in June. She is very grateful for the tireless efforts of all who have participated in this premier production of *A Yellow Light*.

Kevin Shenk (Katherine) has "trod the boards" since the age of 6. Her credits include over 800 live T.V. performances of Kraft Playhouse "Studio One" and a long running role on "A Brighter Day." She made her Broadway debut in the original production of *Inherit the Wind*.
