

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



In New York City, he has collaborated with playwright Alan Ball, author of the film American Beauty, directing his play Power Lunch and staged the premiere of Andy Halliday'S I CAN'T STOP SCREAMING.



Jerry O'Donnell A founding member of Provincetown REP. Jerry directed the companies first season For HEAVEN'S SAKE. He also directed the staged reading of Maggie Barrett's GIVE IT UP. He has appeared in Rep productions of ILE and LONG VOYAGE HOME (directed by Jose Quintero) MEN'S LIVES, LONELY PLANET, THE TRIP TO BOUNTIFUL, and FOR HEAVEN'S SAKE. New YORK AND L.A THEATRE CREDITS INCLUDE Burn This, Vieux Carre' and RULES OF LOVE (directed by Charles Nelson Reilly. Film and TV credits include LOVE ALWAYS, JAG, BROOKLYN SOUTH, and recurring roles on NYPD Blue, The Young and the Restless and as a quest star on ANGEL. Jerry is excited and thankful to be returning for a sixth year and to be working with this talented cast and director.

Judith Partelow is pleased to appear in her first season with the Provincetown REP. A member of Actor's Equity having worked in many productions on the East Coast, she chooses to live and work on Cape Cod. With the Provincetown Theatre Co. she has appeared in The Key, Hay Fever, Seascape, THREE HOTELS, AGNES OF GOD, and others, and has been proud to appear as a guest artist at the APA in Orleans, the Chatham Drama Guild, and The Wellfleet Harbor Actor's Theatre. For Eventide Festival she has portrayed Susan B. Anthony, and on August 20th will perform as Anna Howard Shaw on the Gertrude Lawrence stage at the Dennis Union Church. Husband Jeff Spencer is often seen on stage with her, and she is proud of her three children: Lucas is the drummer with Grabb at Bubbala's this summer, Amanda is performing her original song with the Boston Pops in Hyannis, and Sam is composing a contemporary opera.

Joe Pintauro is a playwright, novelist, and poet. His play MEN'S LIVES received its New England premiere with Provincetown REP. It originally premiered at Sag Harbor's Bay Street Theatre Festival in August 1992 and had a second production in 1993. REINDEER SOUP was commissioned by the Young Conservatory of the American Conservatory Theatre and was produced in San Francisco in 1992. His previous play RAFT OF THE MEDUSA premiered at New York's Home for Contemporary Art in the summer before moving to New York's Minetta Lane Theatre. Raft of the Medusa has since been produced in many other cities including Los Angeles, Baltimore and Montreal. Beside Herself was produced at the Circle Repertory Theatre. He has written two collections of short plays: WILD BLUE which was produced by the Glines at the 47th Street Playhouse, and ON THE WING which was produced by the Barrow Group at the Riverwest Theatre. His other plays include Snow Orchid, Cacciatore, and Dawn, which ran at New York's Manhattan Theatre Club under the title By The Sea, By The Sea, By The Beautiful Sea in an evening that included plays by Lanford Wilson and Terrence McNally. He has also written several award-winning books of poetry.




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Paul Ricciardi - Recent Theatre credits include The SILENT ALSO SPEAK at the Arlington Center for the Arts, The REALLY BIG WEDDING DRESS with the 2000 Women on Top Theatre Festival co-produced by Centerstage and Underground Railway Theater, and SURREAL LIFE with TheatreZone. Paul spent two years creating/performing new material with Wig Kitchen Improv Theatre Lab. He has worked also with the triangle Theatre and The Theatre Offensive. He will begin an MFA / Acting program this fall at Trinity Rep Conservatory in Providence, RI.

Eddie Rutkowski has appeared locally in the Nora Theatre's production of As Bees in Honey Drown, the Speakeasy Stage Company's Jeffrey, Love! Valour! Compassion! and in The Breakwater Theatre's production of I Don't Like the Seaweed. He has performed twice with the Boston Lyric Opera, enjoyed a run with the Boston company of Shear Madness, and worked for two season's with the Alabama Shakespeare Festival. For the past several years Eddie has been working primarily on camera with roles in Unsolved Mysteries, and the independent films Floating and Never Met Picasso. Eddie earned his BFA from Adelphi University, his BFA from Adelphi University, and his MFA from the University of Alabama, and Studied at the National Theatre Studio in London.

Jacqueline Scott is back for a second season with the Rep having played Carrie Watts in last years' THE TRIP TO BOUN-TIFUL. She first had the privilege of doing a Horton Foote script on the live television show OMNIBUS opposite Helen Hayes. She made her Broadway debut in THE WOODEN DISH with Louis Calhern and went on to INHERIT THE WIND with Paul Muni. She was brought to California for a movie called MACABRE, distinctive only because she met her husband of 42 years, Gene Lesser. Features have included: "Charlie Varrick" opposite Walter Mathau, "Fire Creek" opposite James Stewart, and "Death Of A Gunfighter" opposite Richard Widmark. She has guest starred in over 150 TV shows, two of her favorites being a CBS Playhouse opposite her teacher, Uta Hagen and the recurring role of David Janssen's sister in "The Fugitive". She recently received an LA Dramalogue award for her performance in EMBRACEABLE YOU which then toured the US and Canada.

Carol Sherry (Costume & Wig Designer) is having a great time in her third season with Provincetown Repertory. She was introduced to Provincetown at the age of six by her stepdad, who has owned a house here since the early 60s. Designing this season's shows gives her a great opportunity to get out of New York for a 'working' vacation. Some of Carol's New York credits include designing wigs for FORBIDDEN BROADWAY, and Radio City Music Hall; and costumes for the NY Ensemble of Early Music and William Patterson University. She plans to have a great summer here with her



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son Benjamin.

Rick Vanzini (Set Design) came to us last year as assistant to designer Doug Kraner on our hit AMPHORAGOREY. This season we invited Rick to return as our scenic designer. He studied architecture at WIT in Boston and worked for a few years in Boston, London, and Ireland until he returned to University to study scenic design at UMASS Amherst. At UMASS he has designed a number of productions, most notably Naiomi Fiuzuka's Polaroid Stories. He has also recently completed a few collaborations with artist/designer Leandro Soto. Together they designed Spell #7 for Robbie McLauley at Trinity College in CT. Just prior to P-Town Rick was in Miami completing a production of LIBORIO WANTS TO ESCAPE, written and performed by Soto. He is using his spare time in Provincetown to put finishing touches on his first musical performance piece entitled Barbra! His future studies will be completed at B.U. this fall.

Andrew Whitehead is happy to be working with the fine people at Provincetown Rep after spending his last three summers doing college and community theatre in Western Mass.' very landlocked Pioneer Valley. Andrew is currently studying theatre at UMASS Amherst, where he has been turning the Valley theatre scene on its ear with his acting and endeavors in sound design. He dedicates his work here to his housemates, past and present.

Ernest L. Williams (Stage Manager) is a three-year company member of Provincetown REPertory Theatre. During the winter he directs throughout the Mid-West and works with playwrights as a dramaturg and editor. Earnest has worked with Missouri Rep., Unicorn Theatre, Coterie, Theatre in the Park, and Lyric Opera in Kansas City, The Pearl Theatre Company and Circle Rep in New York, and various companies in Ohio, Wisconsin, Iowa, and Kansas. Mr. Williams served as Artistic Director of Robidoux Resident Theatre and as resident Stage Director for Civic Opera Theatre of Kansas City. Earnest directed the premieres of Zone 3 and Good Behavior and the workshop productions of Living Dolls and a new holiday opera The Juggler of Notre Dame.
