PETITION OF WILLIAM A. SCHAN, COMMISSIONER OF CORPORATIONS AND TAXATION, UNDER G. L., c. 155, s. 50A FOR THE DISSOLUTION OF CERTAIN CORPORATIONS ORGANIZED UNDER THE LAWS OF MASSACHUSETTS

## ORDER OF NOTICE

William A. Schan, Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation, having filed a petition under authority of General Laws, chapter one hundred and fifty-five, section fifty A, as inserted by chapter four hundred and fifty-six of the Acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-nine wherein he recites that the corporations listed in said petition were organized under the laws of Massachusetts and that either they have failed to comply with the provisions of law requiring the filing of reports or returns with the said Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation or the State Secretary for two consecutive years; or that said Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation is satisfied that said corporations have become inactive, and that their dissolution would be in the public interest; and wherein said Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation prays that the corporations listed in said petition be dissolved, thereupon it is

ORDERED that said William A. Schan Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation, give notice to each of the corporations named in said petition to appear before our Supreme Judicial Court, to be holden at Boston within our said County of Suffolk, on the first Monday of September, next, if they desire to be heard, then and there to show cause, if any they have, why the corporations named in said petition should not be dissolved as prayed for.

Such notice is to be given by the Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation by mailing a copy of the within order of notice to each of the corporations named in said petition, postage prepaid, at least fourteen days before said first Monday of September, next.
