Funeral services for the late Miss Jessie Taylor Matheson, 97, one of Provincetown's oldest residents, who died March 14 after a long illness, were held Saturday afternoon at the Nickerson Funeral Home. Rev. Norman R. Farnum, pastor of the Federated Church, East Orleans, presided, and interment was in the family tomb in Provincetown Cemetery.

Miss Matheson was born in Provincetown, daughter of William and Mary Matheson, and lived here all her life. She was graduated in local schools and attended Bryant and Stratton Business School in Boston. She had assisted her grandmother, Mrs. Mary S. MacMurray in a millinery shop which was located at the corner of Court and Commercial Streets.

She was a member of the old Church of the Pilgrims, Congregational, and a member of Chaccoquet Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star.

Survivors include three nieces; Mrs. Carrie Merrill of Provincetown; Mrs. Mary Besa of Santiago, Chile; and Mrs. Jessie Van Umerson of Manchester, N. H.; a great-nephew, George F. Miller, III of New York City; and a great-niece, Mrs. Mary Henrique of South Weymouth.
