The auction, handled by Dick Bourne of Hyannis attracted one hundred and fifty people. Following the sale of the house, Mrs. West's personal properties were put on the block. Handsome antique pieces by the score were sold in quick succession by the glib and expert Dick, whose swift chatter kept the crowd in high spirits.
