27 Commercial St is a 1-1/2-story, 3 bay dwelling is set partially below street level. The steeply pitched side-gable roof is clad with asphalt shingles contains a modern skylight and exhibits partial returns at the cornice. Window openings contain 6/6 double hung wood sash with operable louvered shutters. The interior brick chimney is painted white. A 1-story, 2-bay, historic addition is attached to the south facade and has a side-gable roof. All doors on building are replacement multi-pane and panel. A 1-story modern addition on the west elevation includes an attached 1-car garage with overhead door.
