1 1/2 story; symmetrical 8-bay; asphalt roof shingles; roofline on west side raised to halifax-style; concrete block exterior west end chimney; centered gable dormer; skylights; wood shingles clad most of exterior, except clapboard clad east side of original section; 2 entrances with wood paneled doors topped by flat hoods, supported by brackets with a wood porch deck, square wood balusters and lattice work around foundation level; porch accessed by wood central steps; 2/2 wood DHS, 6/6 wood DHS, 1/1 wood DHS, 2/2 wood DHS in dormer; 2-story, flat roof addition on rear (north) covered with wood shingles and containing 6/6 wood DHS;
