Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

47 Commercial St. is a 3-story, 3-bay dwelling with a 2-story rear addition; The roof is clad in wood shingles and includes two gable dormers, snow guards, and central brick chimney; the eaves of the house and dormers are boxed in vinyl with partial returns; the exterior is clad in wood clapboard with corner pilasters, the gable cheeks are clad in wood shingles; Fenestration includes 2/2 wood windows with operable shutters; The primary entrance is an enclosed gable vestibule with a flat Italianate hood supported by embellished brackets over historic wood pane and panel door.
