45 Commercial St. is a 3-story, 5-bay heavily altered building with multiple rear additions; The side gable roof is clad in wood shingles with a wood cornice and partial returns and contains two large modern gable dormers; The primary façade is clad in clapboard with corner pilaster; secondary facades are clad in wood shingles; Fenestration includes 6/6 DHS vinyl windows; The primary entrance has a modern door surround with pedimented gable and pilasters.
